





This lake was the site of votive offerings during the Iron Age period (500BC-500AD). Inhabitants of the nearby Navan Fort would have placed offerings in the lake as part of their spiritual rituals. Four bronze trumpets were found in 1798 during the cutting of a drain, and human bones were found nearby.

The scheduled area is outlined in red on the map. The line follows the ancient level of the lake, visible as a slight break in slope to the north-west, north and north-east, and represented by the property boundaries to the east and south. To the west the line follows the edge of the spoil heaps of the adjacent quarry.
