This small standing stone is located in the field immediately west of that in which Ballynoe Stone Circle is located. It is situated on an east facing gentle slope and is intervisible with the circle.

The stone has a blocky profile, is about 1.4m high and 1.2m wide. Smaller stones clustered around it's base might be the result of field clearance, but it seems more likely that they are all that remains of a field boundary in which the stone once stood. A post and wire fence boundary immediately south would affirm this.

The stone is likely to be associated in some way with Ballynoe stone circle and should be scheduled as an important part of the prehistoric landscape.


Site description

This standing stone is located in the field immediately west of that in which the Ballynoe stone circle is located. It is located on sloping ground and is intervisible with the circle.

It is blocky in shape and is about 1.4m high and 1.2 thick. - Small stones clustered around its base may be the result of field clearance, but it seems more likely that they are all that remains of a removed boundary in which the stone was situated. A field boundary immediately south (post and wire) seems to affirm this.

The stone is likely to be related in some way to Ballynoe Stone circle and should be scheduled.


